The Global Methane Hub (GMH) was established to reduce methane emissions urgently and equitably. While carbon dioxide has historically driven warming from high-income countries, methane is a short-lived climate pollutant that drives rapid warming, with approximately 80% of current emissions originating in low- and middle-income countries.

GMH exists to accelerate reductions in methane emissions across energy, agriculture, and waste sectors where action can deliver immediate climate, health, and economic benefits.

Project Partnerships: GMH finances and co-designs collaborative projects with public-benefit organizations working directly to mitigate methane. While GMH has a strong emphasis on supporting efforts in the Global South, it supports activities globally where they advance the GMH mission.

Strategic Convening: GMH brings together governments, civil society, researchers, and funders to align strategies and accelerate coordinated action in the interest of the public benefit.

Expert Advising: GMH serves as a knowledge hub and trusted partner, providing guidance on methane mitigation strategies, data sharing, and field-building. GMH staff who work on the projects are experts in the sectors (energy, waste and circular economy, and agriculture) in which GMH focuses or the regions where the work is being implemented (globally, with regional teams in Africa, Asia, and Latin America and critical support staff in Europe, the U.S., and Oceania).

How does the organisation generate income or revenue?

GMH raises funds primarily through grants from private foundations, corporations, and governments, and may receive funding from other lawful sources consistent with its charitable purpose. The Executive Board, with oversight from the Supervisory Board, allocates this income to programmatic and operational needs in line with the approved budget and applicable funder requirements. The majority of income is dedicated to projects in partnership with charitable partners, with the balance used to cover GMH's annual operating costs (e.g., personnel, administration, audit).

GMH applies due diligence, conflict-of-interest screening, and mission-alignment checks to safeguard independence and ensure compliance with applicable laws and donor requirements. Restricted funds are tracked and applied to the designated activities.

Each project is selected and implemented with partners whose activities align with its methane mitigation priorities and advance the public good, with a particular emphasis on communities and ecosystems most impacted by methane emissions. Proposals are identified in close collaboration with partners, with program staff working alongside them to ensure strategies are context-specific, grounded in subject-matter expertise, and designed for measurable impact.
